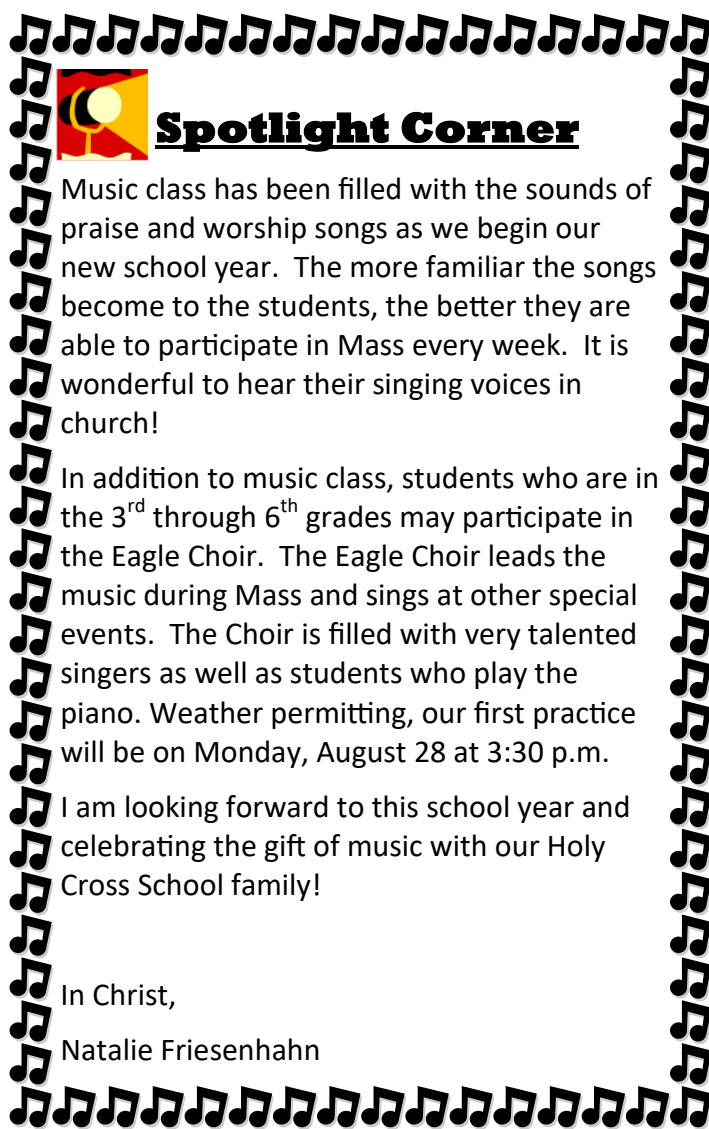

Disaster kit checklist

Keep supplies in a portable waterproof container or backpack so they're ready to use or take with you.

- ✓ A flashlight and several extra batteries, candles and waterproof matches or a lighter
- ✓ A battery-operated radio, plus extra sets of batteries
- ✓ An emergency gas/water shutoff wrench, to shut down your utilities
- ✓ A first-aid kit and three days' worth of medicines (as well as refill information)
- ✓ Bottled water and nonperishable food for at least three days, plus a can opener
- ✓ A pen, paper and your file of essential documents
- ✓ At least \$50 cash
- ✓ A whistle to use should you be stranded
- ✓ Travel-size toiletries, hand sanitizer and toilet paper
- ✓ A change of clothes and blanket for each household member
- ✓ Pet supplies, including leashes, and a copy of pets' medical records
- ✓ Consider buying a hand-crank combination cell phone charger, radio and flashlight in case of an extended power loss. One model to try: the Etón American Red Cross (\$30; amazon.com).
